- Highly elaborated knowledge in research methods, particularly in theoretical and experimental research.
- Particular focus on theory-driven lab and field experiments, studies combining experimental and empirical data, and/or online experiments.
- Independent high quality teaching experiences; ability to teach in English (immediately) and willingness to teach in German (no later than 5 years after start of employment).
- Basic knowledge of German (B2-level or the willingness to acquire this level in due course).

- Post-doc or other related employment history (for at least several months) after the PhD in the field of Behavioral and Experimental Economics and Finance.
- Experience in third party funding.
- Academic mobility (during/after PhD) and embedding in an international academic network in the field of Behavioral and Experimental Economics and Finance.
- Social competence, in particular teamwork abilities; co-operation and communication skills to facilitate an interdisciplinary dialogue between science and society.
