The doctoral candidate will be working in the Institute of Sustainable Economic Development within the Research Unit of Agriculture / Environment. The candidate will write a doctoral thesis in one of the following fields: agricultural policy analysis, industrial organization of the food sector, efficiency and productivity of firms in the agricultural/food sector. In addition she/he will teach classes of two hours per week, provide assistance to students and contribute to organizational and administrative tasks of the unit.

Successful candidates for this position will have a master degree in economics, agricultural economics or comparable programs. Strong analytical skills, experience with quantitative research methods (econometrics) and proven interest in relevant topics are expected. Areas of interest may include industrial organization, production economics, trade theory, political economy and welfare economics. Excellent command of the English language and the willingness to learn German are expected.
