

Post-doc positions in microeconomics

at Alpen-Adria Universität Klagenfurt

Up to two positions are available in international projects funded by the Austrian Science Fund (FWF) and Österreichische Nationalbank (OeNB). Conducted research will likely concentrate on problems relating to applied game theory, contract theory, and mechanism design. The two positions are full-time, fixed-period appointments limited to two and three years, respectively.

Appointees must hold a PhD degree (or equivalent) in economics, operation research, mathematics or a related field at the time of hiring. The successful candidates will join the group at the chair of microeconomics <https://www.aau.at/team/schweinzer-paul/>, a research team with wide international recognition.

- There is no teaching obligation but teaching appointments can be arranged if desired.
- Knowledge of German is not required but beneficial for social and administrative integration.
- The positions come with substantial travel funding.
- The expected starting date is October 1st 2018, but details are negotiable.
- Applications should include a CV, letter of motivation, diplomas, a job market paper, and the names and coordinates of at least two referees.

The monthly gross salary for these positions is €3.711,10 (paid 14 times a year).
