Starting in fall 2017, the Max Planck Institute for Research on Collective Goods (MPI) is establishing a new research group under the lead of Prof. Matthias Sutter. Therefore, the Institute aims to fill

Up to 8 positions as Post-Doc or PhD-student in Behavioral and Experimental Economics

The successful candidates are expected to have an excellent background in experimental and behavioral economics, very good skills in data analysis, a sound background in theory, a strong motivation to pursue independent research, to contribute to the interdisciplinary agenda of the Max Planck Institute (with its research groups in economics, law and psychology), to present their work at conferences and to participate in the activities of the institute (seminars, workshops, etc.).

The Post-doc positions are initially limited to three years, but are renewable for another three years. Applicants should have or be very near completion of a Ph.D. in Economics or an equivalent qualification (such as psychology or management).

The PhD-student positions are initially limited for three years, with an option of renew it for one more year. Applicants should have or be very near completion of a Master in Economics or an equivalent qualification (such as psychology or management).

There is no teaching obligation involved in both types of positions. Salary is paid in accordance with the rules for federal employees in Germany. We offer civil service employment benefits.
