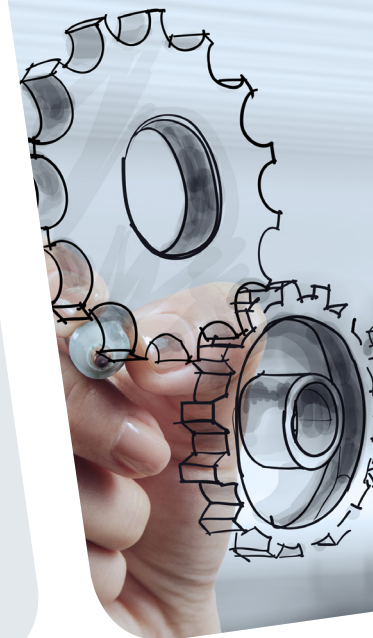

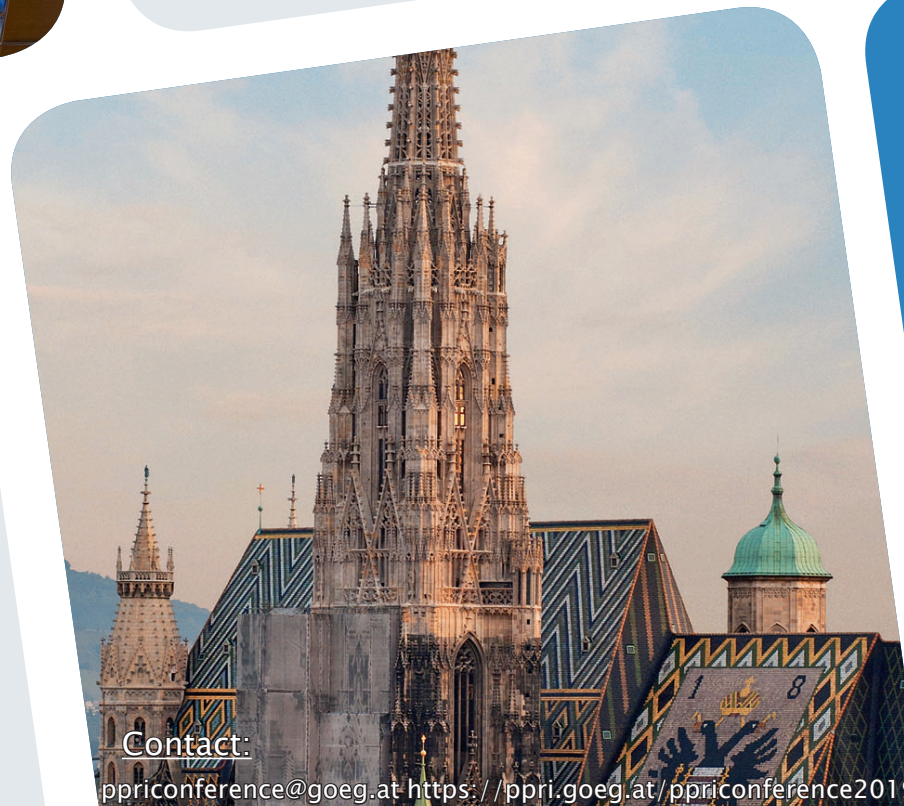

About the Conference

A variety of pricing and reimbursement policies are used in different health care systems to ensure equitable access to medicines for all patients at affordable costs. However, millions of patients all over the world lack access to innovative treatments and medicines, and this has

many different reasons. The conference aims to bring together thought leaders from around the globe to discuss 'burning' issues in pricing and reimbursement policies of medicines – both from a global as well as European perspective.

Objectives

- to present research findings and on-the-frontier academic analyses and to showcase best practice examples of pharmaceutical pricing and reimbursement policies
- to discuss current challenges and develop strategies to tackle them
- to support policy-makers by offering tools to be well prepared and equipped to address the challenges of the future.



Key topics

- Strand 1: Local challenges, global learnings? What can other countries learn from best-practice examples in the field of pricing and reimbursement of medicines?
- Strand 2: 'Fake' prices – Are price surveys still useful?
