### About Martin Feldstein

Martin Feldstein is the George F. Baker Professor of Economics at Harvard University and President Emeritus of the National Bureau of Economic Research. From 1982 through 1984, Feldstein served as chief economic advisor to U.S. President Ronald Reagan.

He is the author of more than 300 research articles and known primarily for his work on macroeconomics and public finance as well as on the sustainability of public pension systems. The well-known “Feldstein-Harioka puzzle” asserts that in the long run, capital tends to stay in its home country. In the late 1990s, Martin Feldstein was a pronounced sceptic about the European integration process, emphasizing the potential costs of an incomplete monetary union.
