Job Summary:

The objective of the fellowship is to provide a development opportunity for those who have exceptional potential in health policy research and scholarship. The fellowship is not restricted to any particular area of health policy. LSE Fellows at this level will act as leaders of a teaching team within an established programme of study. They will be expected to have sufficient breadth and depth of specialist knowledge in the discipline to lead within established teaching programmes.

Duties/Responsibilities:

Teaching

- Contributing to the scholarship and intellectual life of the School by conducting teaching which will enhance the School's high reputation as a research-led teaching institution
- Supervising, teaching and examining masters level students through lectures, seminars, course work and tutorials
- Acting as personal tutor and providing pastoral care
- Supervising personal tutees for their end of year dissertation, participating in dissertation workshops throughout the year and referring supervisees to expert advisors where appropriate
- Holding regular office hours (at least 2 per week)
- Marking practice essays, assessed essays and exam papers during the academic year; and marking dissertations and projects
- Proof-reading exam papers and organising exam script distribution and collation of marks to/from markers
- Undertaking examination-related duties, such as invigilation and script marking, as required
- Participating in regular teaching meetings, with academics and administrators involved in the course(s)
- Identifying learning needs of students and defining appropriate learning objectives

The successful candidate for this LSE Fellow post will be expected to teach approximately 80 hours per annum on Executive MSc Health Economics, Outcomes and Management in Cardiovascular Sciences.

Research

- Developing and pursuing a coherent programme of health policy research e.g. through publication(s) arising from their PhD or from their post-doctoral research
- Presenting research at national and international conferences
- Developing a body of high-quality publications in peer reviewed journals
- Developing a national/international reputation for research in their area of expertise

**Administration**

- Managing academic administration arising from teaching responsibilities (e.g. undertaking class preparation and marking, with guidance as required)
- Contributing to the management of Executive MSc Health Economics, Outcomes and Management in Cardiovascular Sciences
